

Archbishop John C. Wester was ordained as a priest on May 15, 1976. He was then consecrated and installed as the auxiliary bishop of San Francisco, as well as appointed vicar general, on September 18, 1998. On January 8, 2007, he became the Bishop of Salt Lake City, and on June 4, 2015, he was installed as the twelfth Archbishop of Santa Fe. He has been a strong advocate for global nuclear disarmament, despite his archdiocese having more nuclear weapon facilities than any other.

Medea Benjamin is the co-founder of the women-led peace group CODEPINK. She has been an advocate for social justice for 50 years. Described as "one of America's most committed -- and most effective -- fighters for human rights" by New York Newsday, and "one of the high profile leaders of the peace movement" by the Los Angeles Times, she was one of 1,000 exemplary women from 140 countries nominated to receive the Nobel Peace Prize on behalf of the millions of women who do the essential work of peace worldwide.

She is the author of ten books, including Drone Warfare: Killing by Remote Control, Kingdom of the Unjust: Behind the U.S.-Saudi Connection, and Inside Iran: The Real History and Politics of the Islamic Republic of Iran. Her most recent book, coauthored with Nicolas J.S. Davies, is War in Ukraine: Making Sense of a Senseless Conflict.

Frank von Hippel is highly regarded as a senior research physicist and professor of public and international affairs emeritus at Princeton's Program on Science & Global Security, which he was instrumental in establishing. He is also a Board of Sponsors member for the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists and co-founder of the Physicists Coalition for Nuclear Threat Reduction. In addition, von Hippel presently sits on the National Advisory Board for the Center for Arms Control and Non-Proliferation, which is the research division of the Council for a Livable World, and is a member of the International Panel on Fissile Materials.

Elena Perez is a New Jersey native who started organizing when she was just 13 years old. Her advocacy centered around promoting mental health awareness before she got involved in gun violence prevention. She started her gun violence prevention advocacy in March For Our Lives as a NJ chapter lead, State Director, and eventually became the Mid-Atlantic Regional Organizing Director before transitioning into her current role as March For Our Lives' Senior Policy Associate. She is passionate about advocating for common sense gun laws as well as advocating and raising awareness around mental health specifically regarding young people. Currently, Elena is a Senior at Rutgers University-Newark, where she studies Non-Profit and Public Administration. She appeared on NJ-PBS 13's Metrofocus in June, 2022.
